A brief rundown of what I've been up to since last Council.

Centenary Launch and other Centenary Events

Unfortunately, the new wine list has not been introduced yet but I am confident that it shall be introduced shortly. We have, however, introduced the Centenary Ale prior to its official launch later this term, this ale has been specially brewed for us and this is the first batch so we can still refine it slightly, any comments on it would be greatly appreciated. I have been working hard at sampling this new ale and a couple of the other new ones we have recently got in, they are very nice.

There has been some discussion about the new vending machines in both the gents' and ladies' toilets in the central core.
