INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL STUDENTS – AMENDMENTS TO NUS NATIONAL CONFERENCE MOTION 606

Proposed by the External Relations Working Group

Conference Believes that

- 1. Students from non-European Economic Area (EEA) countries will have to apply for a work permit after their two foundation years.
- 2. Permits are only granted if no suitable EEA candidates are found.
- 3. Many non-EEA students will be unable to secure these permits and thus unable to complete their medical training, leaving them in a position where they can not fully qualify to practice medicine either in the UK or their home country.

Conference Further Believes that

- 1. Students who chose to study medicine in the UK did so in good faith, expecting to see their training through to full qualification.
- 2. Denying students the right to complete this training is deeply unfair and an issue that the Government must address

Conference Resolves

 To work with relevant organisations in lobbying the Government to allow all current medical students from non-EEA countries to complete their training in the UK.
