### Imperial College Union Returning Officer Report A Note by Daniel Hill

### **General Comments**

- The Sabbatical and Student Trustee 2020 elections were a success, with 3,393 individuals voting casting 19,489 votes the largest number of votes cast on record for a sabbatical election.
- An election de-brief meeting to discuss the successes and failures in this election and to provide suggestions for next years election was held on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> March.
- The two hustings held in da Vinci's and in the Southside Social space were poorly attended by students. It is advised that next year a new approach should be adopted.
- Turnout by faculty was as follows: FoE = 22.9%; FoM = 18.1%; FoNS = 29.4%. The Department of Life Sciences had the highest turnout of all departments with a whopping 46.8% followed by the Department of Physics with a 36.5% turnout.
- Turnout by student type was as follows: 9.8% of all research postgraduates; 7.3% of all taught postgraduates; and 33.1% of all undergraduates.

### **Election Complaints**

- During the election period, 11 complaints were received and processed by either ICU Court or the Elections Committee or the Deputy Returning Officer and Returning Officer. All complaints were resolved.

### Results

- The Returning Officer and Deputy Returning Officer dealt with a number of complaints early on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> March after voting closed on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> March. Due to the good nature of many of the candidates and the quick workings of the DRO and RO the results of the 2010 Sabbatical and Student Trustee Elections were announced after Union Council on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> March 2010 in da Vinci's Bar.
