Notes

1. At the end of the year, sabbatical officers are considered for Honorary Life Membership to reward their year as officers;
2. Sabbatical officers cannot normally be considered for other Union awards in their year of office;
3. Students who take their sabbatical year in the middle of their studies are eligible to be considered for a Union award in a later year;
4. Sabbaticals who take their year at the end of their course have no further chance to be nominated for an award;
5. Charlotte Ivison, Heather Jones and Kadhim Shubber, who are recommended for Union Fellowship, all took their sabbaticals in the middle of their course, and have had a final year, in which they have been nominated for Fellowship;
6. Monya Zard and Scott Heath have taken their sabbatical year after the completion of their course.

Believes

1. Charlotte Ivison, Heather Jones and Kadhim Shubber are fully deserving of Union Fellowship;
2. Monya Zard and Scott Heath have ‘continuously served the Union and/or enhanced the student experience in an exceptional manner, usually over a number of years’, which describes Union Fellowship in the Union Awards Policy;
3. The fact that Monya Zard and Scott Heath have taken held office after they have completed their course should not count against them in how the Union rewards their service;
4. That Monya Zard and Scott Heath should be awarded Union Fellowship.

Resolves

1. To award Monya Zard Union Fellowship;
2. To award Scott Heath Union Fellowship.
