Purpose of Tour:

The sports of Gaelic football have been growing strongly in Europe over the last number of years. The spread of Gaelic football has in recent years encouraged its recognition as a BUCS sport but on a larger scale, its recognition on a world stage such as the Olympics.

This is a very close club and with many of the senior members leaving the university this year, this club will give the newer members a chance to bond and insure the long and lasting success of the club for years to come.

Tour activities:

This year we propose a tour, staying 5 night from 04/07/2014-09/07/2014.

The itinerary is to fly to Munich on 4/07/2014 staying 2 nights and playing a game against Munich GAA on the 5th, we will then board a sleeper train to Split on the 6th where we will spend 2 nights competing against Split GAA on the 8th. We will fly back to London on the 9th of July.
