Motion to Reverse the Change of Titles to Officer Trustee Positions

A motion proposed by Christopher Kaye and Seconded by Abigail de Bruin

1. This Union Notes

- Last year as a result of the 'Role Review' a paper was presented to Council and to Trustee Board to change the Bye Laws of the Union
 - This change affected the descriptions of all the Officer Trustee Roles and the titles of two roles for the 2015-16 academic year:
 - Deputy President (Finance & Services) to change to Deputy President (Activities & Finance)
 - Deputy President (Clubs & Societies) to change to Deputy President (Activities & Development)
- A paper was brought to Council this year and Council has voted to recommend to the Trustee Board to overturn this decision

2. This Union Believes

- There have been a number of people that have raised concerns about the new names – particularly their lack of clarity in terms of how responsibilities are divided
- Workload is not a good reason to shift the responsibilities of an Officer Trustee
 - Officer Trustees are supposed to have an oversight role
 - If operational and administrative duties in a particular area or role are too high the Union should respond to this demand by shifting staff responsibilities not by increasing the responsibility of a second Officer Trustee to the detriment of other areas of the organisation
- Last year it was felt that 'Services' was unclear since many parts of the Union are a service
 - It should be made clear that 'Services' relates primarily to Commercial Services and Retail in particular
- Role names do not uniquely define the role
 - Overlap is possible and even encouraged where sensible
 - Officers may take on projects outside of their role particularly if it is not clear who should have primary responsibility
- The titles rather than the job description are the most visible descriptor of the role

3. Trustee Board Resolves

To accept Council's recommendation that the names of Officer Trustee
Positions be reinstated as Deputy President (Clubs & Societies) and Deputy
President (Finance & Services) in time for the Big Elections for 2015-16
