

Discussion on Acceptable Behavior within Union Activity

Union Notes:

- Students participating in activity carry with them responsibility for the reputation of both Imperial College Union and Imperial College London
- During Club, Society or Project activity, student behavior and conduct must lie within the law as well as within morality, common decency and Union Policy
- Student-led activity and involvement within activity is fundamental to the Union's principles
- Union (including Club, Society and Project) activity should be inclusive to all members

Union Believes:

- Student's should not be discouraged from engaging in Union activity
- Poor behaviors are exhibited by a small minority of students
- Points Permitting unacceptable behavior is indistinguishable from encouraging or forcing such behaviour

For Discussion:

- Has an antisocial culture become the norm in some clubs
- How best to actively discourage such behaviour in Union activities
- What powers would CSPB, Management Groups, clubs or elected officers benefit from having in tackling these issues?

Potential outcomes:

- Council statement on current position, and intentions for the future
- Action CSPB to review CSP Policy and actively address any failing in process that could prevent future unacceptable behaviour
