Events

Over the summer break preparations were made for Freshers' Fortnight and Autumn Term as a whole.

Academic Liaison and Welfare

Drop in sessions started last year on Monday lunchtimes have continued, but have moved from the RSMU office to G35 room next to the undergraduate study room. These drop in sessions are there for students and are advertised weekly, however it is rare that someone drops in. We would like to create an in house student survey to gauge whether this is due to; a) not wanting to use a student run service to solve academic/welfare issues, or b) there being no pressing student issues in undergrad RSM students.

Finances

We had a revamped approach to our sponsorship application this year to try and encourage companies in a horrible economic climate to sponsor us. We have also looked outside the traditional Oil/Mining/Trading companies, applying to clothing companies and the finance sector. We have produced a glossy new flyer. We have also been phoning the companies that aren't replying.

- Currently we have had no success
- The contacts we have always used for sponsorship, who have always been happy to sponsor us, are no longer happy to do so.

We have had to put up events prices as a result, which some students are not happy with. E.g. Freshers dinner tickets were only subsidised for 1^{st} years, older students had to pay face value, £35 and £38 respectively. Previous years we have been able to give £30 and £35 respectively. Similarly bar night had to go up from £7 to £10.

I worry that the increased prices will eventually lead to less people wishing to attend the events, if sponsorship is not soon acquired.
