#### RSMU Freshers Fortnight 2016 Report

#### 1 Introduction

This survey was conducted to critically evaluate the 2016 Freshers' Fortnight events organised by the Royal School of Mines Union in order to advise on the future organization of enjoyable and welcoming events. This report focuses on respondents from first year event participants. Analysing the results we aimed to gain a greater insight into the welfare of RSMU members by assessing how included, comfortable and safe they felt during freshers' fortnight. The survey was conducted as an online qualtrics survey, and was distributed to first year Materials and ESE students during designated lecture time. The distribution and timeliness of this survey is in concordance with that of the 2015 survey (released on paper).

#### 2 Results

The proportion of students which responded to the survey was high. 72 out of 79 ESE students (91%) and 84 out of 107 students (78%) participated.

Prior to any events, tables were held at Freshers' fair by RSMU, MatSoc, DLB and GPS committees. When asked which tables students attended, 30% visited RSMU, 23% visited DLB, 17% visited GPS, 17% visited MatSoc, 48% visited RSM sports tables, and 32% students said they visited none of the RSM tables. Turnout at freshers' fair was found to be particularly low amongst Materials students, with only 30% visiting the MatSoc table and 48% visiting no tables at all. Students were asked if they felt they had enough information about RSM prior to freshers' fortnight, and a significant 29% answered no. Most communication about RSM events was conducted via the facebook group, and it was found that 14% of respondents were not members. Of those that were members of the facebook page, the proportion of those that felt they were not well informed did not change. When asked their preferred means of communication, 65% said email, 38% said facebook, and 8% said other. (Some gave more than one answer).

Students were asked which events they attended, and how they would rate these out of five (one being the worst, five being the best). The mean score and number of attendees for each, as well as cost per person for RSM is summarised in table 1. Less Materials freshers attended events overall, which is especially significant considering there are more Materials freshers than ESE freshers. However, from those that did attend, there was little difference in the rating of the events between subjects, except for where they were rated more highly on average by Materials students.

The highest rated events were found to be those with the most attendees. In contrast, cost per head did not appear as a trend with ranking. Students were also asked why they didn't attend events. The most popular response was "busy" (64%) followed by "not interested" (30%) and "too expensive" (20%). Only 8% said they missed events because they did not know about them. An "other" option was also available and notable responses included: "It's more of a fact that I don't drink and drinking is a large social aspect here", "too much alcohol", "not suitable for me due to religion".

Students were also asked about whether they felt comfortable and safe at the events. It is significant that this question (Q6 in the survey) was answered by only 107 people. 4 people said they did not feel comfortable - only 3.7% of those that responded. When asked why, 3 people said it was because they don't drink, and only 1 said "other". 5 students out of 107 said they did not feel safe at an event. 4 of these gave alcohol related responses ("drinks", "my liver was scared", "I can't think straight when I'm drunk", "Very messy"),

with one person who felt unsafe due to "having to commute back home".

Students were asked which accommodation they were in, and whether they felt happy travelling to and from the events. 88 students answered yes (83.8%) and 17 students answered no (16.2%). Of those that answered no, 12 were from Woodward, 1 was from Southside/Eastside, 2 were from Wilson House, 1 was from Pembridge Hall, and 1 was from other accommodation.

When asked whether they would recommend RSM events over other Imperial College events, 91 students out of 105 (87%) said yes, with only 14 students (13%) saying no. Students were also asked for "any other comments", a list of which are included in the appendix.

#### 3 Limitations

Limitations of this survey include the possibility that those that are not engaged with RSM events may be less likely to respond to the survey. The most attended event among the was the freshers' dinner, which 82 freshers attended from booking. Of those that responded to the survey, 81 said they attended the dinner. This means that 97% of students who attended the freshers' dinner responded to the survey, in comparison with 84% of all students. This means we may not be reaching those that did not attend events with the survey, however it means that for the most part, we have feedback from those that did attend the events.

#### 4 Conclusions and Recommendations

Overall, the results are overwhelmingly positive and suggests events are run well and for the most part are inclusive. There are a minority who feel uncomfortable at events (however this is less than last year) and improving the experience of these students is where the work needs to be done. A marked improvement has already been seen from last year. In 2015, 32 students said they felt uncomfortable to attend, compared to only 4 in 2016. However, no students said they felt unsafe in 2015, but 5 said they felt unsafe in 2016.


From the results, it seems developing the non-drinking events and encouraging attendance to them may be helpful. Travelling home from events, particularly from Woodward was something some respondents were unhappy with. Similarly to 2015, of those that felt uncomfortable travelling home, the majority were travelling to Woodward. Public transport may be something students will adjust to throughout the year as many freshers are new to London, but arranging transport, particularly for transport to Woodward after Freshers' events is something to be considered. Holding an event at or near Woodward is something else to look into.

Communication about the RSM and events is another area for improvement. Email is the preferred method of communication for most students, and this can be quite easily implemented. The table structure at Freshers' Fair is something else to be reviewed.

In conclusion, events are run well, with most students recommending them over other events. In 2015, 18% of Materials students and 8% of ESE students did not recommend RSM events over college events, however in 2016 this was 13% for both Materials and ESE students. Together with the events of the ratings of the results, it seems there is little division between the opinions from each subject for this years' cohort, however lower Materials turnout persists.




### Q1 - What department are you in?

# Q2 - What year group are you in?







Q4 - Which events did you attend during freshers fortnight? Please rate the events you did attend out of 5.








# Q6 - Did you feel comfortable attending the events?







### Q11 - Did you feel happy travelling to and from the events and your accommodation?



Q12 - In hindsight would you recommend RSM events over other Imperial College events?


