## **Responses:**

- I. HoSVC mentioned the 1994 Education Act in which universities decide who defines as a student
- II. Union president mentioned a declaration in associate membership policy that any one on interruption of studies is an associate member

#### **Bye Laws Discussion:**

- III. Considered how many meetings is more appropriate until a member's absences are a concern, suggested 2, 3, or to scrap the notion all together
- IV. Considered the amount of days for directed responses to items, 7 days was suggested but will remain at 5 days for papers and 2 college days for direct responses
- V. Mentioned Council meetings needing to take into consideration a break every hour to make meetings more inclusive
- VI. Explained disciplining of trustees
- VII. Explained warnings or bans from premises
- VIII. Explained complaints against returning officers
- IX. Commented on decisions not being validated
- X. Stated constituent union officer role descriptions, considered whether the bye laws define this, or should if the constituent unions have the right to define this
- XI. Mentioned committees to by laws
- XII. Suggested management group chair elections
- XIII. Mentioned seconders regarding year representative nominations

## Question:

- Council member asked how members remain represented if representative members of the council do not attend the 2/3 meetings proposed
- II. Council member asked the definition of direct response
- III. Council member noted that constituent Unions Postgraduates are mentioned as social members as opposed to full members and wondered why this was contradictory to the decisions of Council

### Response:

#### Action:

- II. Insert a clause stating that a Council member is deemed to have resigned their voting rights on Council and Council have the rights to remove this if a representative does not attend Council meetings
- III. To move subject of direct response to standing orders
- IV. To create clarity on direct response, such as stating a direct response is a paper in direct response
- XIV. To seek legal advice on decisions not being validated
- V. Remove constituent union officer role descriptions from bye laws and a policy to be brought forward for next Council
- VI. To add a clause that Union Council can create and dissolve subcommittees
- VII. To include that Boards of trustees according to the constitution have some limitations on what they can do
- VIII. To include proposal to abolish seconders for elections
- IX. In the future to have a vote regarding seconders for elections
- X. To insert constituent unions should have constitutions
- XI. Clarify how constitutions get approved
