- V. Comment Concerns were raised from clubs/societies supplying volunteers for summer ball re health and safety, and how the volunteers are being treated.
- VI. Question Why does summer ball plans for next year need to go to Board of Trustees rather than come to Council?
- VII. Comment suggestion of a working group to review/evaluate this year's ball after the event.
- VIII. Question concern was raised re Felix report of £20000 monthly loss at H-bar, and that the atmosphere in H-bar has suffered since withdrawal of chef by College catering. Asked what Council is doing to find/review College accounts to scrutinise, as well as how to escalate this issue. An FOI request was suggested.
- IX. Question clarification was sought on the ongoing work with H-bar re new menu.

Response

- IX. Presenter gave details but explained that she was not directly involved in those areas.
- X. Presenter requested that any complaints to be sent to her, and any that she has been aware of has been addressed. It was explained that due to summer ball being followed immediately by Exhibition Road Festival next day, there are significant logistical challenges for example having to vacate before 8am. In the future will potentially look at changing date or venue to avoid this issue will consult students via survey.
- XI. This is a big financial commitment especially if moving venue, so would need to go to Board of Trustees.

 The presenter explained that there are already a lot more student engagement and transparency this year compared to previous balls.

 Will ensure similar engagement and clear communications for next year.

- Suggested that it would be better for a focus group of interested members to discuss rather than bring to full Council.
- XII. The Chair suggested at next Council to have an update re planning for summer ball 2020, and to form a working group reporting to next year's Council.
- XIII. Presenter explained that the accounts has been requested but have not received them. Will continue to push for them. Main focus is to get a food service run by the union into H-bar, discussion and work ongoing. DP-Welfare commented that definitely more work is needed but focus should be on how to make the service better and looking forward.

Chair explained that the student dissatisfaction and feedback has featured in senior level discussions, work is currently ongoing to incorporate student voice and engagement systematically into catering service changes. The presenter is working heavily with catering services over the new catering strategy which will seek to change view of students as partners not just customers.

XIV. The presenter explained that discussions has been undertaken with stakeholders around new H-bar menu and using the H-bar facilities. The Chair will share complaint procedures.
