CSPB Budget Meeting Minutes:

- India opening agenda straight into budgets before referring to action tracker
- CSPB MG committee member introductions
- No official apologies
- CUs to give small updates with budgets

Green Highlight – Recommendations

Yellow Highlight – Budget Revision

Budgets:

REV RSM Motor club

- Big event London run fees going up without explanation £650 to enter
- Minibus hire transport for rotation and tow to Brighton + fuel increase
- Consumables for upkeep:
 - Custom made products for different vehicles needed
 - Specific for each vehicle listed with reasoning petrol, oil and tooling
 - Phone line query needed for safety reasons
- Taxes and insurance:
 - Contingency funding for
 - Specialist insurance through Haggerty to cover vintage vehicles
- Vehicle specific budgeting
- With fuel increases, can you ask for more in the budget?
 - Guidance on applying through ADF for next year if needed
 - Q membership: explanation that the vehicles are mascots and shouldn't be charged for access and maintenance
 - Provide a service for the university for wider events for the students relevant amount of significance
- Q what wider student activity do you run?
 - Student trips to halls during freshers and as show pieces
- Consideration to using the budget for specifics rather than dipping into funding on fuels and other running costs make sure they don't spend incorrectly for the next committee
- Historically normal to request 100% of the costs.
 - Something bigger, they'll ask for support from CU no other source of income
- Any concerns with budget?

Budget approved

REV VVMC

- Uxbridge Petrol no funding requested
- General expenditure on oil/fuel/events/insurance
- Q should the emergency one-off repairs need to be included on annual budget
 - o If it becomes part of your yearly budget, it isn't technically a year-on-year need
- Start charging on hire to other CUs to build up a reserve for bigger repairs and upkeep
- Promotional line removed from budget
- £700 rather than 1000 in petrol reduction
- Bring down overall budget
- Q one off radiator budgeting, each year something gets targeted
- Note to consider for next year we discuss whether the grant towards that project went to the specifics and whether the funding was used for the project purpose

REV RCS Motor

- Events for separate cars for the shows
- Fuel for fresher hall trips
- RCSU events fuel £60 added to balance budget for RCSU events
- Summer ball Add £10 to the budget line to balance
- Different amount to Alumni rather than students? Usually donate a little more
 - Offset the ticket income by charging for the minibus hire for non-students
 - Reduce minibus grant request by alumni reduce £80 to be made up by alumni charging
- VCC London Brighton: Profit from the event where does it go? Towards tools
- No promotional money minus £30 from General
- Insurance significantly higher than other vehicles: heavy so can do more damage
- Maintenance
 - Stock material + replacement tools: more specific. Need for making new
- Not requesting anything new from last year. Almost a 45% increase on last years budget reasoning.
- All increase is from oil and fuel that dominates budget differential.
- Based on market value.

Budget Approved with amendments

RCSU Exec

- If they need to pay for telephones to be added to the grant £100
- Operations committee briefly explained
 - Revisit to fresher booklet broadsheet printing is a core feature and is generally funded
 - Fresher events for welfare items and socials
 - Tea party one event to request money for food
 - Department rep funding for putting on events
- Peculiar budget line query
 - o Running barfest and other social events coming from faculty

Budget Passed with amendments

CGCU Budget:

- Discussion on funding welfare supplies: condoms/rape alarms etc. from a central fund
- Adobe licences: note to think about buying a general licence for all our CUs with college
- Take off £30 for first aid kit SU to make sure we distribute to all CUs
- Cleaning products reduced to £60 to be provided by SU
- Stationary reduced to £25
- Discussion over profit for CGCU budget £1700

 CGCU to re-submit a more detailed budget at next CSPB – budgeted to spend £3000 less than asking for in the overall budget

Silwood Budget

- Works slightly differently
 - Must support the general student population at Silwood
 - o Ever changing students only studying for 12 months
- Animal protection policy to suggest funding the care of Mr Tinkles
- Agreement before to raise grant funding by £1000 to recover from deficit
- Factoring membership fees into the budget
- ChickenSoc general maintenance and food
 - Climbing soc fuel for transport
 - o Hard to budget for ongoing societies with the high turnover of students
- Travel subsidies for societies for trips and parade
- Add an extra £200 for an ADF fund contingency for student activity
- Silwood Colours:
 - Look into funding guidelines around the CUs and their budgets, provide comparison between them and work out budget allocation on that
 - Reduce printing cost to £25
- Social events:
 - Removing the projector and fog machine from budget line
 - Soft drinks reduced to £30
- Lobby for college to get funding for Silwood social events
- Internationa
 - Leave the food as it is if they receive departmental funding it will be cut

- Mail chimp join our account: Take the cost out of the general line
- Add £500 common room furniture: taken from the budget line
 - Should be coming from ADF
- Discussion between asking for more grant than awarded for last year
